

CRT 300 - Peer Knowledge Presentation

OVERVIEW

This course marks your final step in the CPRA Professional Development Certification process. The course is an opportunity for you to showcase your ability to think critically about the issues facing you and the sector.

Learners will create and present both in writing and orally, a case study that addresses a past, current, or future work related issue. The case will include reference to core competencies and link back to areas outlined in the *Framework for Recreation in Canada: Pathways to Wellbeing*.

COURSE OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of this course the learner will be able to:

- Identify a work related issue.
- Write a case study.
- Create and deliver an oral presentation.
- Answer questions related to his or her thought process and decision-making.

MODULE SCHEDULE

This course is designed around the two main assignments. The due dates for each assignment are firm. The first assignment, written case study, is due two weeks prior to the oral presentation.
